## Student Sessions

1. **Be a Role Model:** This session will bring out the leader in the students. They will learn how to properly define what is a role model, who are current role models in our life, why being a role model is important, and recognize how to become one for their fellow peers, as well as the school and community.
2. **POWERR of Public Speaking:** In this session students will learn the six components of the POWERR formula and be able to identify the important speech delivery strategies. This will help to alleviate the stage fright you might experience if you have to give a speech.
3. **Delivering the SkillsUSA message.** Many of us are pretty familiar with SkillsUSA, but often we come across those that are not familiar with organization. (This could even be you) In this session, we'll discuss how we can inform other about SkillsUSA in a consistent and accurate manner.
4. **Be Your Best Self:** How many of you would consider yourself a "busy" person? In this session we are going to put our busy lives on hold and take some time to figure out just who and what we are, and why it is important to be yourself.
5. **Time Management:** Time is a constant in everyone's life. It is important that we deal with it every day! In this session we will take a look at what time management is, how we use it and why it is important in our own lives.
6. **Exploring the Program of work:-** The heart of SkillsUSA is the program of work; or what your chapter is going to do throughout the year. This session helps to spell out the activities and projects that you plan to get done as a plan of action.
7. **State Officer Discussion:** This is your opportunity to hear from your state officers about why they ran, what difference it has made, and what could be possible for you if you became a state officer.

## Advisor Sessions

1. **SkillsUSA Framework and Career Readiness Curriculum:**- The SkillsUSA framework provides an opportunity for students to develop personal, workplace and technical skills. That is why the SkillsUSA framework was used to create the Career Readiness Curriculum (CRC). This practical and flexible standards-based curriculum seamlessly integrates framework components into classroom instruction. Learn how to apply the framework and use the CRC in what you already do
2. **New Materials and Curriculum:** Learn about Impact and Ignite and get ways to use these resources in your classroom.
